

What is Non-Disclosure of Information (NDI)?

Non-Disclosure of Information, or NDI, in Child Support Services (CSS) is a safety measure you can request for your case if you have concerns about your safety or the safety of your children.

NDI protects your address, date of birth, and social security number from being included in documents filed with the courts by the county child support office. It will also protect the same information for your children. If you request NDI, this information will be redacted or not appear in the documents. NDI does not protect other documents filed by other parties in your court case. It is intended only for CSS documents.

What do I need to provide if I want NDI?

You do not need to provide any proof that you have safety concerns to ask for NDI on your CSS case. The only requirements are:

- 1. Complete the Affidavit or Declaration of Non-Disclosure, sign, and date it. Ask your county CSS office for this form, ensure it is completed, and give it back to them. The CSS office will then file it with the court.
- Provide an alternate address where you can receive mail. This address can be a friend or relative's house, a PO Box, the Address Confidentiality Program (ACP), or another address to which you have access. <u>Colorado ACP Program</u> <u>Link</u>

What if the other party already knows where I live?

Even if the other party knows where you currently live, requesting NDI on your case is best if you have safety concerns. If you move in the future, that address will already be protected if you have NDI on your case.

Can I have NDI removed from my case?

Yes, you can request that NDI be removed from your case at any point, just as you can request to have NDI added at any time.
